At Warner Center Racquet Club (Woodland Hills, CA) I was the head pro and ran one of the largest junior programs in Southern California, before becoming the assistant manager. At that time the club had 26 tennis courts, 6 indoor racquetball courts, a swimming pool, pro shop, and a snack bar.

A couple years later I was offered the Tennis Director position at the Racquet Club of Irvine (CA) where I was brought in to develop a high level junior program. This was accomplished over a couple year period and I am proud to say we produced a number of nationally ranked juniors who went on to play in college, and a few even professionally.

In 1983 I opened my first restaurant. Over a period of 22 years I owned and managed 4 restaurants and a catering company. No tennis.

I now joined a tennis club where I practiced and played, participated in USTA leagues, and was nominated to the member board.
